Writing is a system that helps develop strong and effective thinking because writing is a bunch of parts that work together and do more together than the parts would do on their own. The elements of any system are components (including subcomponents), inputs, outputs, boundaries, and functions. These elements work together. Writing includes all these elements. One function of writing, as a system, is making thinking visible. The parts of the system include the Five Fs and the Levels of Analysis. Each of these parts functions as a subsystem, meaning that within these parts are smaller parts. The smaller parts of the Five Fs subsystem are focus, form, filler, flow, and feeling. The smaller parts of the Levels of Analysis subsystem are description, explanation, connection, reflection, and metacognition. The inputs of this system include ideas, facts, beliefs, and experiences/observations. The outputs include understandings, explanations, questions, theories, and knowledge. Knowledge is an understanding of reality. It is useful because when you understand reality you can respond to it and you can, when possible, transform it. The knowledge that writing as a system for thinking produces makes you powerful. It can help you solve problems. It can also help you build and sustain community.
